The farming community, once again, supported Daffodil Day at the Matawhero Stock Drive raising a record amount for Gisborne East Coast. KIA ORA – E TE IWI

In preparation for delivery within the Gisborne/Tairāwhiti region, significant time was invested in meeting with local providers, community people, and kaimahi working in the cancer sector.

Two Kia ora – E te Iwi hui were held on the East Coast in partnership with local organisations. The hui were co-hosted with Ngāti Porou Oranga, Ruatoria in Tikitiki and Te Puna Manaaki a Ruataupare in Wharekahika (Hicks Bay). These partnerships enabled the programme to be delivered in a way that reflected local priorities and strengthened community engagement.

Feedback from participants was overwhelmingly positive. Attendees appreciated the commitment of guest speakers who travelled from Gisborne and other regions to share information about available services and engage in open, honest conversations within rural communities.

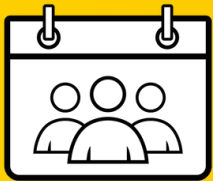

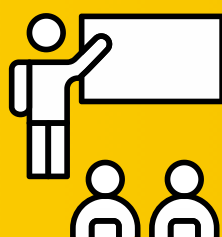
