CHAIR'S REPORT

It is hard to believe another year has passed since I had the privilege of taking on the role of President. Serving the Whanganui-Rangitikei-Waimarino Centre has been both an honour and a rewarding experience, and I continue to be inspired by the dedication, compassion and generosity of everyone involved with our organisation.

As a Centre, we continue to see increasing demand for our services. During the year we supported 125 new clients, and our volunteer driving service completed an outstanding 916 trips for treatment, including 862 journeys to Palmerston North and 18 journeys to Wellington, ensuring people were able to access vital cancer treatment when they needed it most. These figures highlight not only the growing need within our community but also the incredible commitment of our volunteers.

This year, we were fortunate to have the support of 392 volunteers who generously gave their time, energy and compassion to our Centre. Whether driving clients, helping in our Centre, assisting with fundraising events, or supporting our community in countless other ways, every volunteer has made a meaningful difference. On behalf of the committee and everyone whose lives have been touched by your kindness, thank you. Our Centre simply could not operate without your commitment.

Our fundraising efforts have once again been outstanding. The community has continued to support our raffles, with every raffle selling out throughout the year. Relay For Life and Daffodil Day are big events for us. It is always encouraging to see such enthusiastic support from the public. One of the highlights of the year was our Art Auction, which proved to be an exceptional fundraising event. A sincere thank you to everyone who donated artwork, attended, purchased items, volunteered their time, or helped organise the event. Its success is a wonderful example of what our community can achieve when we work together.

Within the Whanganui region, the programme was delivered in partnership with Ngāti Rangī Iwi Health in Raetihi. The hui brought together guest speakers from local health and community service providers, alongside representatives from MidCentral Hospital, who shared valuable information and responded directly to participant questions.

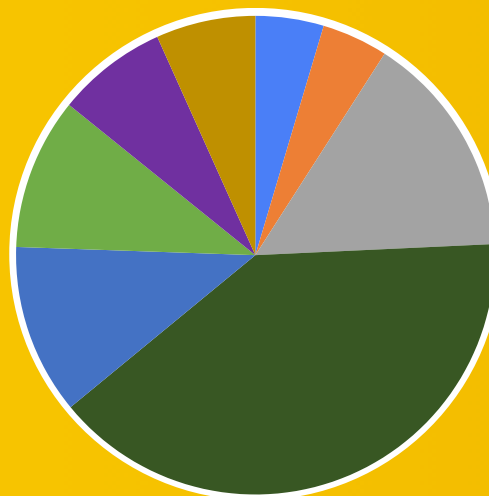

2. RFL Grants received (\$6,100) are included in the Relay For Life income figures above. In the audited Financial Statements RFL grants are included in Grants Received Operational.
3. Grant income above is \$6,100 less than what shows in the Audited Financial Statements. This is due to RFL grants showing in Relay For Life income.
4. Sundry Income is made up of: NTA Patient Travel Reimbursement, General Sales, Investment Income, Member Income, and other sundry income.
