If you or someone you know has been diagnosed with cancer, the Cancer Society Waikato/Bay of Plenty is here to walk alongside you.



Cancer Navigators

We help you navigate your cancer care with confidence and create a tailored plan for when and where you need it.

We can help with:

- One to one emotional and practical support navigating every cancer journey
- Information about cancer and treatment
- · Support in managing treatment side effects
- Connecting you with the right support at the right time
- Referrals to healthcare providers and community services.

Support Groups

Support groups offer a welcoming space where you can connect with others who understand what you're going through.

- Available for individuals living with cancer and their whānau
- Facilitated by trained volunteers and Cancer Navigators
- A chance to share experiences, give and receive support, and build connections.





Transport to Treatment

We can help take the stress out of getting to your cancer treatment.

- Transport is provided by trusted, trained volunteers
- We'll pick you up from home (or a designated meeting place) and bring you back after treatment.

Accommodation

If you need to travel to Waikato Hospital for treatment, you may be eligible to stay at the Cancer Society's Lions Lodge — a warm, welcoming 'home away from home' designed for rest, recovery and healing — kai whakaoraora.

- Accommodation for those undergoing treatment
- Nutritious meals, regular activities, and a supportive environment
- Shuttle service to and from Waikato Hospital
- A chance to connect with other on similar journeys.
